#### Introduction Service Academy Director

Kia Ora, I am Corporal Allison Pene, the Whanganui City College Services Academy Director. I have served 16 years in the New Zealand Army firstly as an Administrator in the Royal New Zealand Army Logistics Corps then as an Operational Support and Information Specialist (OpSIS) in the Royal New Zealand Signallers Corps. During my time in the Army, I have held many appointments from Detachment Commander, Section Commander; including with the Youth Development Unit, OpSIS Senior Non-Commissioned Officer in the Operations Cell and have been appointed in numerous instructional roles. My last appointment was with the 3rd Signals Electronic Warfare unit working in the Operations Cell. I have deployed on exercises overseas and have completed many exercises around New Zealand.

I worked with the Youth Development Unit looking after the Northern and Central Services Academies from December 2015 - December 2017. It was during this time that I discovered my passion for working with youth and helping them to strive to reach their potential.

Without challenges there are no rewards. Over the period of the course, students will be faced with challenges. It is up to the students as to whether they stand up and accept the challenges so that they can reap the benefits of the rewards. This will be achieved through personal discipline, adherence to policies, and dedication to their studies both physical and intellectual. As we say in the Army "Do the mahi, get the treats."

#### **SERVICES ACADEMY MISSION AND VISION**

#### **Mission**:

To provide skills, values and education that enable Services Academy students to take a positive role in New Zealand society.

#### Vision:

Whanganui City College Services Academy initiative is designed to assist Year 12 and 13 students to make informed decisions for their chosen career pathway, learn a number of life skills conducive to their own success and contributing to their long term economic independence and social well being.

#### Services academy course outline:

During the course, students will cover the following areas:

- 1. Military Service Skills, marching and military terminology.
- 2. Physical Training, improving health and wellbeing.
- 3. Adventure based learning (ABL), teamwork and leadership.
- 4. Students core subjects of their choice.

With all these, you will acquire the skills needed to obtain the Vision and Mission of the Services Academy here at Whanganui City College.

#### **COURSE OUTLINE**

The course draws on several areas of the curriculum. These are:

#### LITERACY, NUMERACY and SCIENCE

Students are expected to achieve literacy, numeracy and science credits and they will be guided when selecting modules to achieve a min of 10 credits in each. From an NCEA standpoint, students are given work at an appropriate level for their achievement. Those at Level 1 or 2 attend Academy classes. If they already have Level 2 they will attend classes outside the Academy. In addition to this there is a focus on testing in the style of the recruit testing for the NZDF. These tests were developed in the 1960s and 70s and have not changed since. As a result, they are very different to the NCEA style of assessment and there is a need to coach students in how to achieve in this type of testing. For example most questions are multi-choice and in addition they are sat under a very high time constraints.

#### **PHYSICAL TRAINING**

Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds. Demand results, give no Excuses. The aim of physical training is to improve fitness, health and wellbeing; both physically and mentally. The course is comprised of: Long Aerobic workouts – running, Resistance training, Circuit training, Pack marching, Beep Test and Army RFL (required fitness level test) consisting of a 2.4km run, push ups and sit ups. This will be used to gauge physical improvements.

#### <u>DRILL</u>

The aim of Drill is:

TO PRODUCE A STUDENT WHO IS PROUD, ALERT AND TO PROVIDE A BASIS FOR EFFECTIVE TEAMWORK.

Inspections and drill will take place on a daily basis.

#### MILITARY HISTORY/LIFE SKILLS/GOAL SETTING/SERVICE PROJECTS/UNIT STANDARDS/ADVENTURE BASED LEARNING.

The above subjects will be conducted throughout the year.

Military History

Students will learn about the New Zealand Army, Navy and Airforce. They will have an understanding of the different trades that are offered and the requirements for entry.

Students will learn about New Zealand's proud involvement in conflicts around the world and participate in ANZAC Day activities both at Whanganui City College and the ANZAC Day commemoration in Whanganui.

#### <u>Life Skills</u>

First aid, Budgeting, renting and banking advice, Personal presentation, ironing and washing, Interview skills, Event planning, Sports coaching, Health and wellness awareness, Tramping and camping, Rope and knot work and New Zealand Army camps.43```31

#### NCEA unit standards

A minimum of 29 Level 2 credits or a minimum of 24 Level 3 credits from various unit standards will be available for students to achieve.

#### Adventure Based Learning

Students will learn to problem solve and work in a team environment. Tasks will start off with close proximity games and then progress to more complex tasks as the group gains confidence and learn to work together in a team situation.

#### Goal setting

Each student will have their own goal booklet, which will be used to set and record a range of goals including personal, career, physical and education. These goal booklets will be updated monthly to check progress. These booklets will also form part of the recording process to the ministry.

Community Service projects

The service academy will seek to serve our community by offering student labour free of charge for worthy community projects. This can be done during school hours (academy lines) or weekends.

Students will also visit the elderly, local kindergartens and local schools.

#### YOUTH LIFE SKILLS CELL

Youth Life Skills Cell will offer the following training camps which will be held in various areas within the North Island. These training camps will be conducted with all lower North Island Academies. These include Tairawhiti (Gisborne ), Wairoa, Napier, Tongariro, Masterton, Porirua, Horowhenua, Palmerston North, Naenae, Murupara, Whakatane and Whanganui College.

1x 12 day induction camp. All students.

1x 5 day Military skills course, bush craft skills and basic army field craft. All students.

1x Junior Leadership course, five days for three to six students that display high standards of academy values and ethos.

1x Advanced Leadership course for two students who display high qualities of leadership at all times.

1x 5 day Endurance event to be held between late September to early November, dependant on NCEA exams.
